We have thoroughly enjoyed STEM week this week. We watched a science workshop full of experiments, rotated around the Year 1 classrooms learning about 2s, 5s and 10s for World Maths Day as well as having a go on Mathletics. Then we took part in a Music workshop and learnt some new songs and finally finished off by celebrating Red Nose day - it's been a busy week!

English

In English this week we have continued working on What the ladybird heard by Julia Donaldson. We have written a detailed police report following the arrest of Hefty Hugh and Lanky Len. We had to describe the crime that had happened and write about what the robbers had said in their police interview. Hopefully those naughty robbers have learnt their lesson!

Maths

In Math's this week we have been counting forwards and backwards in 2s, 5s and 10s! We have used numicon, coins, number lines and 100 squares to support our counting. We have looked at patterns in the numbers when counting e.g. when counting 2s from 0, all the numbers end in 2, 4, 6,8 or 0. We have paired socks together when counting in twos and counted hands when counting 5s and 10s. Look up Jack Hartman on youtube and practice counting in 2/5/10's so that you know them off by heart.

Topic

In science this week we have started learning about plants. We went on a hunt around the school looking for different signs of Spring. *Can you remember what we saw growing? Why have they started to grow now? If you find any signs of Spring growing when you're out and about bring in a photo so we can share with the class.* We have also started to learn about what plants need to survive.
